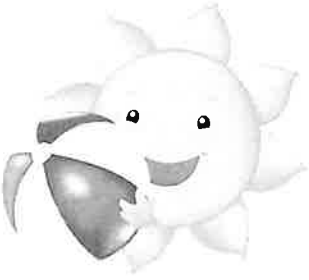

BOOK CLUB

Our Book Club will meet on Tuesday, August 11, at 1:00 p.m. to discuss *A Calamity of Souls* by David Baldacci. Set in 1968 in southern Virginia during the Civil Rights Movement, this historical legal drama follows Jack Lee, a white attorney who reluctantly agrees to defend Jerome Washington, a black man accused of murdering a wealthy white couple. As the trial progresses, Jack joins forces with civil rights attorney Desiree DuBose to challenge a case shaped by prejudice, corruption, and injustice. Through their efforts, the novel explores themes of courage, integrity, racial inequality,

and the pursuit of justice, while illustrating how deeply societal biases can influence the legal system. Blending courtroom suspense with historical fiction, *A Calamity of Souls* invites readers to reflect on the difference between justice and the law and consider how the issues raised in the novel continue to resonate today. We look forward to a thoughtful and engaging discussion with everyone.

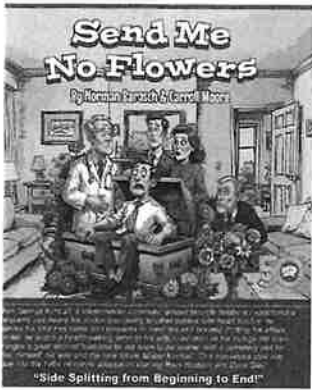

Thank You, Kitchen Crew

Back in the spring, after a bidding process, Berks County Area Agency on Aging decided that they wanted to streamline the Berks County Meals on Wheels (MOW) program by having Helping Harvest provide frozen meals to all Berks County clients starting July 1, 2026. Prior to this time, the Boyertown Area Multi-Service Kitchen had been providing the 80+ Berks County MOW clients in the Boyertown area with the same hot entrée and cold sides that were served for the Congregate meal at the Center.

Currently, the Kitchen continues to prepare meals for our Montgomery County clients, but without the Berks County MOW clients we have fewer clients to prepare for, so that we no longer need as many volunteers. Consequently, we have had to cut volunteer hours and eliminate some volunteer positions because of this change, and hence we are losing several long-time Kitchen Crew volunteers.

We want to thank Dave Renninger, Tracey Reigner, Bill Ehrie, Sharee Kenna, Darlene Haring, and the Boyertown Employability Skills Training (BEST) students for all their hard work and support over the years. We truly appreciate everything you have done to help the Kitchen, and we wish you nothing but the best! Thank you so much, and we will miss all of you dearly!!
